## Overview of the Vote

The Minister for Treaty of Waitangi Negotiations is responsible for appropriations in the Vote Tari Whakatau for the 2025/26 financial year covering the following:

- a multi-year appropriation of \$1,400 million for the four-year period from 2025/26 to 2028/29. This
  appropriation is for the settlement of historical Treaty of Waitangi claims and provides for the payment
  of redress through the transfer of assets (cash and property) from the Crown to claimant groups and
  for the payment of interest on the settlements
- over \$36 million for departmental expenses in settling historical Treaty of Waitangi claims and determining customary interests in the takutai moana (marine and coastal areas)
- over \$13 million for financial assistance to applicants to support determining customary interests in the takutai moana (marine and coastal areas)
- nearly \$6 million for claimant funding to support the settlement of historical Treaty of Waitangi claims
- nearly \$2 million for the operations of Ngāpuhi Investment Fund Limited, and
- \$250,000 for financial assistance to support finalising transfer of ancillary redress.

These adjustments are due to the transfer of Māori Crown Relations functions from Vote Te Arawhiti to Vote Māori Development to enhance efficiency and effectiveness in delivering services to Māori communities.

### 1.3 - Analysis of Significant Trends

#### **Output Expenses**

Output expenses remain fairly consistent over the trend period. Time-limited funding was provided in 2023/24 to support the higher than anticipated demand for determining customary interests.

#### Other Expenses

The fluctuation in other expenses primarily reflects the size and timing of Treaty Settlements under the Historical Treaty of Waitangi Settlements multi-year appropriation, as shown in the table below. Expenditure for Historical Treaty of Waitangi Settlements is recognised when a treaty settlement deed has been initialled.

- additional funding of \$17.300 million in 2023/24 to address urgent cost pressures to continue funding the Takutai Moana Financial Assistance Scheme, and
- time-limited funding of \$25.200 million in 2024/25 for the post-settlement resolution of New Zealand Defence Force Redress at the Royal New Zealand Air Force Base Woodbourne.

#### Capital Expenditure

Capital expenditure in 2020/21 relates to the Crown's \$150 million capital investment in the Ngāpuhi Sovereign Fund entity.

#### Non-Tax Revenue

The non-tax revenue mainly relates to interest received from lending to implement the Ngāti Whātua Ōrākei Deed of Settlement.

Note 3 - The standard for this performance indicator was increased in 2025/26 as the target number for mandate recognition varies in accordance with current negotiations work programme.

Note 4 - An Agreement in Principle is agreed between the Crown and a claimant group. The document describes the broad outline of a settlement package and is signed by the claimant group and the Minister for Treaty of Waitangi Negotiations.

Note 5 – Te Tari Whakatau does not have full control over the achievement of this measure as it is partially reliant on claimant groups agreeing the proposed redress as well as overlapping interests being resolved and negotiations being concluded to the satisfaction of both the claimant group and the Crown.

Note 6 - A Deed of Settlement is the complete, detailed and formal settlement agreement between the Crown and the claimant group.

Note 7 - The standard for this performance indicator was increased in 2025/26 as the target number for signed terms of negotiation varies in accordance with current negotiations work programme.

Note 8 - Terms of Negotiation is agreed between the Crown and a claimant group. The document outlines the objectives for the negotiations.

Note 9 - Settlement legislation operationalises the Deed of Settlement.

Note 10 - The standard for this performance indicator was increased in 2025/26 as the target number for legislation enactment varies in accordance with current negotiations work programme.

Note 11 - These performance indicators were transferred in 2025/26 from the Māori Crown Relations MCA appropriation to the Treaty Negotiations and Marine and Coastal Area Customary Interests appropriation.

#### Current and Past Policy Initiatives

#### Reasons for Change in Appropriation

The decrease in the appropriation for 2025/26 is mainly due to:

- a decrease of \$2 million for time-limited funding on supporting the implementation of the strategy to restore the Ngāpuhi Crown relationship, and
- a decrease of \$1 million for time-limited funding for an arbitration hearing to resolve relativity mechanism disputes.

This was partially offset by \$580,000 transferred funding for claimant participation in Waitangi Tribunal inquiries in 2024/25.
