Overview of the Vote

The Minister for the Environment is responsible for appropriations in Vote Environment 2024/25, which cover:

- a total of nearly \$136 million in funding and grants to third parties for water initiatives
- a total of nearly \$127 million in payments to territorial local authorities for the Waste Disposal Levy
- a total of just over \$119 million for the development and provision of policy advice and other support on environmental matters, implementing policy and the monitoring of domestic environmental management and educational programmes
- a total of nearly \$87 million for waste minimisation initiatives and to build a resilient system for reducing, recycling, and managing New Zealand's waste responsibly
- a total of just over \$58 million in funding for Product Stewardship Tyres scheme initiatives
- a total of just over \$30 million in funding provided to the Environmental Protection Authority
- a total of just over \$23 million in funding for reducing emissions from waste initiatives
- a total of nearly \$8 million for services provided by third parties for the investigation, management, and remediation services relating to contaminated sites
- a total of just over \$4 million for grants to third parties for domestic environmental management and education programmes, and contributions to international institutions
- a total of nearly \$1 million in funding for wi to engage in co-management arrangements, and
- a total of nearly \$1 million for capital expenditure.

The Minister of Climate Change is responsible for appropriations in Vote Environment for 2024/25, which cover:

- a total of nearly \$2,182 million for the allocation of New Zealand emission units to the economy
- a total of just over \$154 million for administering the Emissions Trading Scheme including for the impairment of debt
- a total of nearly \$50 million for policy advice, reporting, operations, and stewardship of matters relating to climate change
- a total of \$40 million for the loss on sale of New Zealand emission units
- a total of nearly \$17 million in funding provided to the Climate Change Commission
- a total of \$8 million in funding to support equitable transitions and community climate action for Māori, and
- a total of just over \$3 million in funding provided to the Climate Change Chief Executives Board.

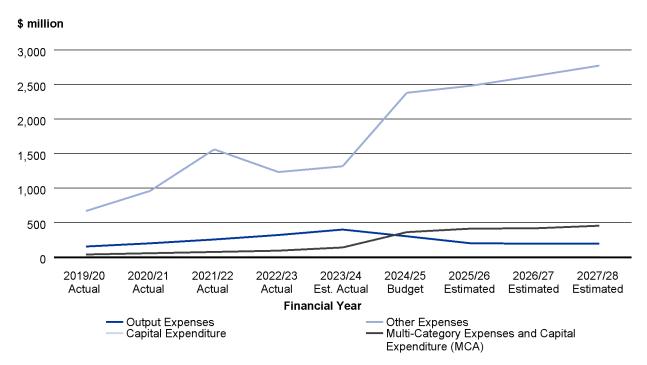


Figure 1 - Vote trends in actual expenses and capital expenditure by appropriation type

The actual and budgeted output expenses from 2019/20 onwards reflect an increase in funding for resource management and water management reforms, and climate change related activities, then reducing following the Fiscal Sustainability Programme from 2023/24.

The variability in Other Expenses relates to the Allocation of New Zealand Units appropriation and reflects the changes in the volume of units allocated and the forecast price of units:

- for the Allocation of New Zealand Units appropriation, the upper limit of the appropriation is set at \$100 per carbon unit from 2021/22 onwards. This increase is to accommodate the uncertainty in the market price of New Zealand units. The estimated actual is based on the current market price per carbon unit at the time of the forecast, and
- the changes in forecast volume of units to be allocated is a result of continuous improvement to the model, assumptions, and activity data for various sectors based on the latest information available at the time of the forecast.

The variability in Multi-Category Expenses and Capital Expenditure (MCA) relates to:

- Waste Disposal Levy disbursement to Territorial Local Authorities to reflect the increase in the Waste Disposal Levy revenue forecast, and
- tyre stewardship fee disbursements to the Product Stewardship Organisations.

Reasons for Change in Appropriation

The increase in this appropriation for 2024/25 is due to:

- an increase of \$47 million in forecast relating to a new output expense category: Freshwater Improvement Fund
- an increase of \$28.247 million in forecast relating to the Contestable Waste Minimisation Fund (including Plastics Innovation Fund) provided to projects that increase resource efficiency, increase reuse, recovery and recycling, and decrease waste to landfill
- an increase of \$23.300 million in forecast relating to a new output expense category: Reducing Emissions from Waste
- an increase of \$21.500 million in forecast relating to the Waste Disposal Levy Disbursements to Territorial Local Authorities and reflects the 50 per cent of Waste Disposal Levy revenue collected is distributed to territorial local authorities to be spent on waste minimisation activities
- an increase of \$15.150 million in forecast relating to a new output expense category: Environment Work Programmes, and
- an increase of \$11.125 million in forecast relating to a new output expense category: Kaipara Moana Remediation.

This increase is partially offset by a decrease of \$838,000 in the Waste Minimisation Administration funding. In 2023/24 there was an expense transfer of funding from 2022/23.
