Overview of the Vote

The Minister for the Environment is responsible for appropriations in Vote Environment 2025/26, which cover:

- a total of nearly \$144 million for the development and provision of policy advice and other support on environmental matters, implementing policy and the monitoring of domestic environmental management and educational programmes
- a total of nearly \$128 million in payments to territorial local authorities for the Waste Disposal Levy
- a total of nearly \$98 million in funding and grants to third parties on activities that reduce environmental harm or increase environmental benefits through investment in a broad range of activities
- a total of nearly \$66 million in funding for Product Stewardship Tyres scheme initiatives
- a total of just over \$52 million for waste minimisation initiatives and to build a resilient system for reducing, recycling, and managing New Zealand's waste responsibly
- a total of nearly \$34 million in funding provided to the Environmental Protection Authority
- a total of just over \$4 million in funding and grants to third parties for water initiatives
- a total of just over \$1 million in funding for lwi to engage in co-management arrangements
- a total of just over \$1 million for contributions to international institutions, and
- a total of nearly \$1 million for capital expenditure.

The Minister of Climate Change is responsible for appropriations in Vote Environment for 2025/26, which cover:

- a total of nearly \$2,046 million for the allocation of New Zealand emission units to the economy
- a total of nearly \$154 million for administering the Emissions Trading Scheme including for the impairment of debt
- a total of just over \$46 million for policy advice, reporting, operations, and stewardship of matters relating to climate change
- a total of \$40 million for the loss on sale of New Zealand emission units
- a total of just over \$15 million in funding provided to the Climate Change Commission
- a total of just over \$10 million in funding to support equitable transitions and community climate action for Māori, and
- a total of nearly \$4 million in funding provided to the Climate Change Chief Executives Board.



The actual and budgeted output expenses from 2020/21 onwards reflect an increase in funding for resource management and water management reforms, and climate change related activities, then reducing following the Fiscal Sustainability Programme from 2023/24.

The variability in Other Expenses relates to the Allocation of New Zealand Units appropriation and reflects the changes in the volume of units allocated and the forecast price of units:

- the Allocation of New Zealand Units appropriation is set at a higher price per unit to accommodate the uncertainty in the market price of New Zealand units. The estimated actual is based on the current market price per unit at the time of the forecast, and
- the changes in forecast volume of units to be allocated is a result of continuous improvement to the model, assumptions, and activity data for various sectors based on the latest information available at the time of the forecast.

The variability in Multi-Category Expenses and Capital Expenditure (MCA) relates to the consolidation of environment-related funds into one category: 'Environmental Investment funds' for activities that reduce environmental harm or increase environmental benefits through investment in a broad range of activities.

- a reduction of \$2.025 million in expense transfers from 2023/24 to 2024/25
- a reduction of \$615,000 for the Crown response to Water Rights Litigation due to time limited funding

- a reduction of \$115,000 in relation to the Te Tiriti of Waitangi obligations, and
- a reduction of \$77,000 in relation to the Ministry's accommodation.

- a reduction of \$750,000 for providing policy and engagement capability and technical expertise to develop and deliver a new Climate Adaptation Act, and
- a reduction of \$301,000 for the New Zealand Emissions Trading Scheme (NZ ETS) market governance work programme.

Reasons for Change in Appropriation

The increase in this appropriation for 2025/26 is due to:

- an increase of \$59.461 million in a new category 'Environmental Investment Fund' to consolidate environment-related funds into one category. This increase also includes the expense transfer of funds from 2024/25 to meet the funding requirements of the committed projects
- an increase of \$13.027 million in the Waste Disposal Levy Disbursements to Territorial Local Authorities reflecting that 50 percent of Waste Disposal Levy revenue collected is distributed to territorial local authorities to be spent on waste minimisation activities
- an increase of \$7.803 million in the Contestable Waste Minimisation Fund due to the transfer of funding from the Reducing Emissions from Waste category, and
- an increase of \$1,000 in the Waste Minimisation Administration is in line with the funding profile.

The above is partially offset by a decrease of \$2.330 million in the Environment Work Programme due to a one-off transfer in 2024/25 from the Contestable Waste Minimisation Fund to meet the funding requirements of the work programme.
