Overview of the Vote

The Minister for Pacific Peoples is responsible for appropriations in Vote Pacific Peoples for the 2024/25 financial year covering the following:

Services purchased directly from the Ministry for Pacific Peoples:

- just over \$27 million for the purchase of communication, project and relationship services required to maintain strong links between Crown and Pacific communities, and
- just over \$2 million for the purchase of policy advice.

Other services:

- just over \$12 million to provide education, employment and skill development programmes for Pacific
- just over \$11 million to provide Pacific peoples with the information and skills needed to succeed in business
- just under \$36 million to facilitate home ownership for Pacific peoples, and
- just over \$1 million for the promotion of positive role models and the provision of scholarships for further education for Pacific peoples.

The Minister for Pacific Peoples is also responsible for:

- · Capital expenditure of \$144,000 for the development or purchase of assets by and for the Ministry for Pacific Peoples.
- Capital injections totalling \$12,000 to the Ministry for Pacific Peoples.

Adjustments to the Summary of Financial Activity Table Due to Vote Restructuring

There have been no restructuring adjustments to prior year information in the Summary of Financial Activity table.

1.3 - Analysis of Significant Trends

Non-Departmental Output Expenses decrease from \$74.564 million in 2023/24 to \$60.769 million in 2024/25. The decrease of \$13.795 million is due to:

- a policy initiative in Budget 2023 that received funding of \$1.800 million in 2023/24 and \$1.350 million in 2024/25. This is for Supporting the Growth, Resilience and Sustainability of Pacific Businesses (decrease of \$450,000)
- a policy initiative in Budget 2023 that received funding of \$1.034 million in 2023/24. This is for Tupu Aotearoa Programme - Increasing Employment and Education Pathways for Pacific People (decrease of \$1.034 million)
- a Covid Response Relief Fund initiative in October Baseline Update 2020 that received funding of \$2.954 million in 2020/21, \$5.844 million in 2021/22, \$4.444 million in 2022/23, and \$4.444 million in 2023/24. This is for Improving Housing for Pacific Families and Communities (decrease of \$4.444 million)
- a transfer of funding of \$120,000 from Departmental Output Expenses in 2023/24. This is for the Building Affordable Homes programme (decrease of \$120,000)
- a transfer of funding of \$193,000 from 2022/23 to 2023/24. This is for Housing Feasibility (decrease of \$193,000)
- a policy initiative that received funding of \$1.363 million in 2022/23 and \$2.023 million in 2023/24, and then a further Contingency drawdown of \$28.611 million in 2023/24, \$35.873 million in 2024/25 and \$40.231 million in 2025/26. This is for Building homes for Pacific People in Porirua (increase of \$5.239 million)
- a policy initiative that received funding of \$10.917 million in 2022/23 and \$6.334 million in 2023/24. This included a \$7.917 million transfer from 2022/23 to 2023/24. This is for the Building Affordable Homes programme (decrease of \$14.251 million)
- a transfer of funding \$1.449 million to Ministry of Housing and Urban Development in 2023/24. This is for the Building Affordable Homes programme (increase of \$1.449 million)
- an October Baseline Update 2023 that received funding of \$41,000 in 2023/24, \$50,000 in 2024/25, \$59,000 in 2025/26, and \$67,000 in 2026/27 & Outyears. This is for Pay Equity settlement for Social Workers (increase of \$9,000).

Departmental Output Expenses decreases from \$41.343 million in 2023/24 to \$29.288 million in 2024/25. The Ministry's Multi-Year Multi-Category Appropriation that commenced in 2019/20 expired in 2023/24 and reverts to an Annual Multi-Category Appropriation. The decrease of \$12.055 million in 2024/25 is due to:

 a policy initiative in Budget 2024 returns permanent baseline savings of \$25.600 million over the forecast period and Outyears of \$6.400 million per annum. This is the Reduction in Back Office Functions - Administration & Discretionary Expenditure (decrease of \$6.400 million)

- a policy initiative in Budget 2023 that received funding of \$1.671 million in 2023/24. This is for Pacific Data and Digital Inclusion (decrease of \$1.671 million)
- a policy initiative in Budget 2023 that received funding \$4.175 million in 2023/24, \$3.968 million in 2024/25, \$3.968 million in 2025/26 and \$647,000 in 2026/27 & Outyears. This included two October Baseline Update 2023 transfers: to the Ministry of Social Development of \$3.100 million each year for 2023/24, 2024/25 and 2025/26, and to the Ministry of Business Innovation and Employment of \$653,000 in 2023/24, \$650,000 in 2024/25, \$650,000 in 2025/26 and \$647,000 in 2026/27 & Outyears. This is for Implementing the Pacific Employment Action Plan (decrease of \$204,000)
- a policy initiative in Budget 2023 that received funding of \$50,000 in 2022/23, \$2.500 million in 2023/24, \$4.648 million in 2024/25, \$3.767 million in 2025/26 and \$2.350 million in 2026/27 & Outyears. This is for Pacific Languages Strategy - fostering languages and wellbeing in media, education, government and communities (increase of \$2.148 million)
- a Covid Response Relief Fund initiative in October Baseline Update 2020 that received funding of \$1.657 million in 2020/21, \$657,000 in 2021/22, \$657,000 in 2022/23, and \$657,000 in 2023/24. This is for Improving Housing for Pacific Families and Communities (decrease of \$657,000)
- a policy initiative that received funding of \$500,000 in 2022/23, followed by a contingency release at March Baseline Update 2023 of \$208,000 in 2022/23 and \$350,000 in 2023/24, and then a further Contingency drawdown at October Baseline Update 2023 of \$289,000 in 2023/24, \$708,000 in 2024/25, \$708,000 in 2025/26 and \$708,000 in 2026/27 & Outyears. This is for Building homes for Pacific People in Porirua (increase of \$69,000)
- a transfer of funding of \$120,000 to Non-Departmental Output Expenses in 2023/24. This is for the Building Affordable Homes programme (increase of \$120,000)
- Reforecast of under-utilised Multi-Year Multi-Category Appropriation into 2023/24 (decrease of \$5.445 million).

Departmental Capital Expenditure decreases from \$350,000 in 2023/24 to \$144,000 in 2024/25 to reflect forecast capital expenditure by the Ministry for Pacific Peoples. This expenditure is often for one-off projects which do not recur between years.

Reasons for Change in Appropriation

The decrease in this appropriation for 2024/25 is mainly due to:

- a policy initiative that received funding of \$10.917 million in 2022/23 and \$6.334 million in 2023/24. This included a \$7.917 million transfer from 2022/23 to 2023/24. This is for the Building Affordable Homes programme (decrease of \$14.251 million)
- a policy initiative that received funding of \$1.363 million in 2022/23 and \$2.023 million in 2023/24, and then a further Contingency drawdown of \$28.611 million in 2023/24, \$35.873 million in 2024/25 and \$40.231 million in 2025/26. This is for Building homes for Pacific People in Porirua (increase of \$5.239 million)
- a transfer of funding \$1.449 million to Ministry of Housing and Urban Development in 2023/24. This is for the Building Affordable Homes programme (increase of \$1.449 million).
