Note 1 - The performance measure has been removed as the Crown Solicitor network is reviewed over a three-year cycle and in recent reviews this has resulted in no significant issues being identified. Where necessary, warrants are provided with minor suggestions on how to strengthen areas of practice that are then considered as part of their next review.

Note 2 - The performance measure has been removed and replaced as not all people surveyed will have access to GLN Online for a multitude of reasons, but they will be departmental lawyers on our mailing list.

Reasons for Change in Appropriation

This appropriation increased by \$3.050 million to \$125.620 million for 2022/23 due to:

- an increase of \$2.500 million in the amount appropriated for the revenue department part of the MCA strategic and operational legal advice and representation which is funded fiscally neutral on a cost recovery basis, and
- an increase of \$550,000 in the amount appropriated for the remuneration cost pressures to give effect to the Public Sector Pay Adjustment (PSPA).
