Note 2 - This measure counts training and employment placements where the eligible Pacific person is engaged in that placement for at least 31 days. Each eligible Pacific person may be placed into both an employment and/or training placement in any two-year period, ie, once for an employment placement and once for a training placement. The two-year period relates to the duration of funding agreements with funded providers which each have a term of two financial years.

Reasons for Change in Appropriation

The appropriation increased by \$193,000 to \$18.273 million for 2023/24 due to a funding transfer of \$193,000 from 2022/23 to 2023/24 for Housing Feasibility programme.

3.4 - Non-Departmental Other Expenses

Housing Pacific Families (M50) (A13)

Scope of Appropriation

This appropriation is limited to contributions toward the costs of developing new affordable homes for Pacific peoples.

- Note 2 This measure is to reflect a target set to achieve better housing outcomes for Pacific peoples.
- Note 3 The number of houses built may vary due to market conditions and supply chain uncertainties such as, raising supply costs.
- Note 4 Housing developers project plans may change along with delays caused by securing suitable sites. This may alter the number of funded affordable homes.
- Note 5 This is an aggregated measure that will combine the number of affordable homes for Pacific people (new builds) achieved through Improving Housing for Pacific Families and Communities (Pacific Affordable Homes Programme) and Building Homes for Pacific in Porirua (Our Whare Our Fale).

Reasons for Change in Appropriation

This appropriation increased by \$35.120 million to \$43.477 million for 2023/24 due to:

- an increase relating to the transfer from the budget contingency fund for the Building Affordable Homes initiative of \$7.917 million from 2022/23 to 2023/24
- an increase relating to the drawdown from the budget contingency fund for Building Homes for Pacific in Porirua initiative of \$28.611 million in 2023/24
- an increase relating to the Pay equity settlement for Social Workers of \$41,000 in 2023/24, and
- a decrease relating to the transfer of \$1.449 million to the Ministry of Housing and Urban Development in 2023/24.

Note 1 - New measures set to provide control on funding arrangements and deliver on improving better living for the pacific community.

Reasons for Change in Appropriation

This appropriation decreased by \$3.554 million to \$41.343 million for 2023/24 due to:

- a decrease relating to the transfer of \$3.753 million to the Ministry of Social Development for the Pacific Employment Action Plan programme at the October Baseline Update 2023
- a decrease relating to the transfer of \$90,000 contribution to Vote Social Development at the October Baseline Update 2023, and
- offset by an increase of \$289,000 from the drawdown of contingency for the Building Homes for Pacific in Porirua programme at the October Baseline Update 2023.
