Reasons for Change in Appropriation

The appropriation increased by \$2.690 million to \$135.959 million for 2024/25 due to:

- an increase of \$1.500 million in the amount appropriated for the revenue department part of the MCA strategic and operational legal advice and representation which is funded fiscally neutral on a cost recovery basis, and
- an increase of \$1.200 million in the Law Officer Functions MCA that is transferred from 2023/24 to fund the deferred and reprioritised IT work programmes, and offset by
- a one-off funding transfer of \$10,000 from the Law Officer Functions MCA to the Ministry of Justice to fund a non-departmental ex-gratia payment.
