#### Reasons for Change in Appropriation

This appropriation increased by \$151,000 to \$4.623 million for 2024/25 due to additional funding in accordance with salary and allowance determinations issued by the Remuneration Authority.

#### Family Court Associates Salaries and Allowances PLA (M19) (A23)

#### Scope of Appropriation

This appropriation is limited to funding salaries, allowances, or fees for Family Court Associates as authorised by section 7E of the Family Court Act 1980.

#### Reasons for Change in Appropriation

This appropriation increased by \$721,000 to \$2.437 million in 2024/25 due to the appointment of additional Family Court Associates to enable faster resolution of disputes in the Family Court.

#### Māori Land Court Judges' Salaries and Allowances PLA (M19) (A23)

#### Scope of Appropriation

This appropriation is limited to costs related to the terms and conditions of remuneration for Judges and acting warranted Judges in the Māori Land Court incurred pursuant to s.13 Te Ture Whenua Māori Land Act 1993.

#### Reasons for Change in Appropriation

This appropriation increased by \$265,000 to \$8.478 million for 2024/25 due to additional funding in accordance with salary and allowance determinations issued by the Remuneration Authority.

#### Senior Courts Judges' Salaries and Allowances PLA (M19) (A23)

#### Scope of Appropriation

This appropriation is limited to the remuneration and allowances of Judges of the Supreme Court, Court of Appeal and High Court as authorised by section 135 of the Senior Courts Act 2016.

#### Reasons for Change in Appropriation

This appropriation increased by \$3.867 million to \$49.770 million for 2024/25 due to additional funding in accordance with salary and allowance determinations issued by the Remuneration Authority.

#### Tenancy Tribunal Adjudicators' Salaries and Allowances PLA (M19) (A23)

#### Scope of Appropriation

This appropriation is limited to funding salaries, allowances, or fees for the Principal Tenancy Adjudicators, Deputy Principal Tenancy Adjudicator, and Tenancy Adjudicators as authorised by section 69 of the Residential Tenancies Act 1986.

#### Reasons for Change in Appropriation

This appropriation increased by \$144,000 to \$7.320 million for 2024/25 due to additional funding in accordance with salary and allowance determinations issued by the Remuneration Authority.

Reasons for Change in Appropriation

This appropriation increased by \$31.069 million to \$726.634 million for 2024/25 due to:

- a net increase of \$21.526 million for implementing a digital case management system aimed at reducing delays and improve access to information, reflecting a fiscally neutral adjustment of \$10.455 million from capital to operating funding, new funding of \$8.571 million, and an expense transfer of \$2.500 million from 2023/24 to 2024/25
- an expense transfer of \$4.800 million from 2023/24 to 2024/25 to support the coronial inquiry into the Christchurch masjidain attack and associated judicial review
- fiscally neutral adjustments totalling \$2.564 million to deliver the Pacific Regional Justice Sector Programme, reflecting agency and grant contributions of \$2.382 million and attendance fees of \$182,000 for the Pacific Judicial Conference 2025
- an increase of \$2.515 million for remuneration costs for staff delivering frontline services, including court and security staff

- an expense transfer of \$1.900 million from 2023/24 to 2024/25 for the completion of business cases and securing building consents on priority courthouses
- fiscally neutral adjustments totalling \$1.262 million to reflect new and updated leasing arrangements
- additional funding of \$857,000 to support the construction of a new Tauranga criminal courthouse
- a fiscally neutral adjustment of \$400,000 to reflect the allocation of Ministry overhead in 2024/25
- a fiscally neutral adjustment of \$162,000 to enable the secure transfer of unpaid safety camera infringement data from Waka Kotahi to the Ministry of Justice, and
- a fiscally neutral adjustment of \$125,000 for transcription services provided to the New Zealand Parole Board.

#### This is partially offset by:

- an expense transfer of \$3.700 million from 2024/25 to 2027/28 for project operating costs associated with the seismic remediation of Auckland District Court, Hamilton District Court, and Wellington High Court reflecting updated timing of costs
- a technical adjustment of \$721,000 to reflect funding returned following the appointment of additional Family Court Associates, which was funded by a separate Permanent Legislative Authority appropriation
- decreased funding of \$545,000 for capital charge as a result of the revaluation of land and buildings as at 30 June 2024, and
- a fiscally neutral adjustment of \$76,000 to Vote Justice to provide funding to the Compensation for Wrongly Convicted Individuals appropriation.
