Note 1 - The word 'held' in the previous performance indicator (Number of Forestry Advisory Service engagements held during the year) was removed because Te Uru Rākau - New Zealand Forest Service (TUR-NZFS) (MPI) is not always the host of the engagement, and this indicator only reports on engagements hosted by TUR-NZFS/MPI.

The budget standard that refers to a 'Minimum of 600 engagements total per year, ensuring that each customer segment (8) is engaged with per quarter', has been updated to be more meaningful or insightful to demonstrate effectiveness of spend. An 'engagement' is any focused interactions with our customer segments for the specific purpose of providing support and advice to the forestry sector, including: (a) visits to landowners to provide advice, (b) workshops with landowners and land users, (c) presentations at formal events, (d) meeting with iwi/hapū and (e) representation at forestry events.

Note 2 - The performance indicator has been updated to clarify that only 'submitted' emission returns are included and other processing functions (such as amendments and assessments) are not in scope for this indicator.

'Submitted' means an emissions return received by TUR-NZFS (MPI) with all mandatory fields and declarations completed and payment from participant (per Climate Change Response Act 2002 section 64(2)) and excludes 'amendments' and 'assessments' defined under the Climate Change Response Act 2002). 'Processed' for the purpose of this performance indicator means emissions returns that have an entitlement direction sent to the EPA (who make the decision and take action to issue NZU's to participants).

Note 1 - The following contextual note has been added to clarify that the relationship between related categories funded in Vote Forestry, and that observable benefits from the grants' programmes will be seen through activities funded in other categories:

This funding is for the effective administration and management of forestry related grants and programmes. The activities that will realise the benefits of the grants and programmes are funded through the following Vote Forestry MCA categories: Forestry: Grants and partnerships programmes; Forestry: Hill Country Erosion Fund; North Island Weather Event: Cyclone Gabrielle Response and Recovery; and the Forestry and Other Economic Development, and Erosion Control MYA.

Note 2 - The previous performance indicator (Number of research outputs for science-based practices and technologies produced in the financial year to improve forest carbon sequestration and long-term carbon stock) has been amended to expand the current output focused measure to also include policy outputs. A variance commentary or performance story will be provided in MPI 2024/25 Annual Report on what those outputs are, and their benefits are. This will provide a more accurate indication of what the programme is delivering.

The budget standard has been reduced to reflect the current scope of the activities and what the programme is delivering.

'Outputs' are the knowledge and insights that are gained from the research contract deliverables that inform policy work and provide insights for the public, and the policy advice generated through the policy process used by TUR-NZFS.

Note 3 - This new performance indicator has been added to provide supporting qualitative account of what the funding through this category is intended to achieve.

Note 4 - The following contextual note has been added for clarity: 'Industry norms' are determined by the independent reviewer by considering factors such as log sale revenues, costs of production, management fees for harvesting and marketing, harvesting rates to logging subcontractors, and payment for log cartage, etc, for similar operations (eg, similar forest types, workplans, contract tenure, location) elsewhere in the region of the sample of forests.

Note 5 - Since 2023/24, MPI has been using an updated methodology that aligns with the guidance provided in the Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet (DPMC) guidelines for Policy Quality Review. DPMC rating scale includes 1=Never, 2=Some of the time, 3=About half of the time, 4=Most of the time, 5=Always.

Note 6 - Since 2023/24, MPI has been using an updated methodology that aligns with the guidance provided in the DPMC guidelines for Ministerial Satisfaction Surveys. DPMC rating scale includes 1=Never, 2=Some of the time, 3=About half of the time, 4=Most of the time, 5=Always.

Note 7 - The previous performance indicator (Percentage of completed inspections for approved annual logging plans subject to post harvest inspections each financial year) has been updated to show that this indicator only relates to Indigenous Forestry.

Note 8 - The wording of this contextual note has been improved: This performance indicator reflects the source of funding and clarifies that the funding is being provided to grantees given that is the primary function of the Wood Processing Growth fund.

Note 9 - The following contextual note has been added for clarity:

Crown Forestry annually commissions an independent review of a sample of its estate to demonstrate that it is meeting its required forest management performance measures. This independent review assesses Crown Forestry's activities against what is expected of a prudent forest manager. This includes (among other things) compliance with statutory and contractual obligations, whether value for money regarding procured contract and sub-contract operations is being received, and effective risk management. This contextual note has been added for clarity.

Note 10 - The previous performance indicator (Number of tonnes of woody debris removed from high priority catchments in Gisborne and Hawkes Bay) has been updated to align with the woody debris treatment plan that is being developed by the Gisborne District Council (GDC). Currently, operations and figures for this plan are being finalised. Actual treatments that occur through that plan will be provided in the variance commentary in MPI 2024/25 Annual Report.

The budget standard has been changed in line with treatment expectations and purpose of funding. The budget standard targets that 'Treatment occurs in accordance with the deliverables and priorities determined by the Gisborne District Council's debris treatment programme'.

The wording of the following contextual note has been updated to clarify definition and scope of 'treatment':

'Treatment' of woody debris includes activities such as:

- removal with disposal offsite
- removal and safely stored onsite
- cutting debris into smaller pieces where environmentally effective, and removal is too costly
- engineered mitigation / containment (eg, slash catchers)
- engineered protective structures for key infrastructure (ie, strengthening or deflection).

Note 11 - The budget standard has been increased to 5,000 ha because all the land for the woody biomass planting programme is expected to be contracted in the 2024/25 financial year.

#### Reasons for Change in Appropriation

The appropriation decreased by \$29.857 million to \$172.863 million for 2024/25 due to:

- expense transfers totalling \$21.550 million as follows:
  - \$13.750 million from 2024/25 to 2025/26 for the Cyclone Gabrielle Response and Recovery, with delays in its sediment clean-up programme due to adverse weather conditions
  - \$7.800 million from 2024/25 to outyears for the Woody Biomass Programme to be realign with the re-phased contract delivery milestones
- transfer of \$5.685 million of funding from Forestry: Capital Climate Response Investments to a newly established multi-year appropriation: Forestry: Capital Climate Response Investment MYA from 2025/26
- a \$2.622 million in forecast adjustment to Crown Forestry expenditure due to a decrease in the forecasted Lake Rotoaira Forest harvest volume.
