Reasons for Change in Appropriation

This appropriation increased by \$267,000 to \$17.220 million for 2024/25 is due to:

- an increase of \$173,000 to fund the provision of electronic forensic investigation services by the Serious Fraud Office funded by Immigration New Zealand, the Financial Markets Authority, and the Commerce Commission
- an increase of \$94,000 for Crown Law Office utilisation of the Serious Fraud Office in Auckland, funded by the Crown Law Office.
