Budget 2022 Information Release

August 2022

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Some parts of this information release would not be appropriate to release and, if requested, would be withheld under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act).

Title: Delivering for, and with, Iwi, Hapu and Māori

Description: Accurate, robust, and relevant Iwi-Māori data is critical to achieving economic, environmental, social and cultural outcomes with, and for, Māori. The initiative addresses inequities and challenges across the data system through system-wide transformation, increased Māori data capability, Māori data governance and data innovation. Iwi, Iwi-Māori, hapu, whānau and Māori are used interchangeably in this bid. This initiative supports building a data ecosystem that enables Iwi-Māori to make decisions for themselves and unlocks the potential for positive self-determined social, cultural, environmental and economic outcomes to achieve wellbeing. This initiative is about having partnerships to pursue opportunities that will enhance the data ecosystem for the whole nation.
