Hey Hamish,

Thanks for this. Our comments are below. Please let me know if you require any further information.

Late changes to the Budget package create significant risks to the accuracy of the fiscal forecasts, financial recommendations and estimate documentation. There is also a precedent risk with amending the Budget package post Cabinet agreement.

However, we note that Cabinet made the following agreements on Monday:



With respect to the Return of Funding for Public Transport Workforce Sustainability and Skill Improvement Programme (Initiative 15720) the Minister of Finance will need to be satisfied that this decision fits within the ambit of recommendation 51 in the Budget Cabinet paper.

The Treasury does not consider the Bus Decarbonisation changes (initiative 15719) to be an outstanding matter consistent with recommendation 52 in the Budget Cabinet paper (final decisions were taken by Cabinet on 29 April) and does not support this saving being returned.

<u>In terms of the paper itself</u>, in order to confirm these changes and reflect them in the fiscal forecasts and estimates, we require agreement from Delegated Ministers **on Monday 6 May 2024**. We recommend that MoF does not formally agree to this paper tonight, but provides direction on her decisions **by 10am tomorrow**.

The attached paper from MoT will need to be amended to include the fiscal impacts of making these decisions (for example, the appropriation tables will be required for options being considered and costings and phasing for recommendation 11 is needed also. We require this information to be in the final signed version in order to reflect it in the forecasts and estimates. We have already advised MOT that this would be required tomorrow, so expect them to be able to turn this around for a new version to go into Ministers weekend bags.


