#### Information Withheld

- [33] 9(2)(f)(iv) to maintain the current constitutional conventions protecting the confidentiality of advice tendered by ministers and officials
- [34] 9(2)(g)(i) to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through the free and frank expression of opinions
- [35] 9(2)(g)(ii) to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through protecting ministers, members of government organisations, officers and employees from improper pressure or harassment;
- [36] 9(2)(h) to maintain legal professional privilege
- [37] 9(2)(i) to enable the Crown to carry out commercial activities without disadvantage or prejudice
- [38] 9(2)(j) to enable the Crown to negotiate without disadvantage or prejudice
- [39] 9(2)(k) to prevent the disclosure of official information for improper gain or improper advantage
- [40] 18(c)(i) that the making available of the information requested would be contrary to the provisions of a specified enactment

#### Budget 2024 decisions - Vote Social Development (Whaikaha)

This letter confirms the decisions made as part of Budget 2024 relating to Whaikaha. I would be grateful if you could direct your officials to work with the Treasury to prepare the necessary Estimates and Supplementary Estimates material for your sign off by 26 April.

In Budget 2024, Whaikaha will receive cost pressure funding of \$1.1 billion over the forecast period. This funding reflects \$80 million in 2023/24 (agreed as a pre-commitment), \$232 million per annum from 2024/25 onwards to address volume pressures; [33]

I am concerned about the continued high cost growth in this area and the ongoing fiscal sustainability of the current model. As such, Cabinet have requested an external review of disability support services [33]

You will need to ensure

the appropriate steps and consultation process is followed before any changes are introduced.

A reminder that these decisions remain Budget Sensitive and should only be shared on a need-to-know basis. My office will provide further advice on the approach to Budget communications. Thank you again for your support towards the successful delivery of Budget 2024.
