- [33] 9(2)(f)(iv) to maintain the current constitutional conventions protecting the confidentiality of advice tendered by ministers and officials
- [34] 9(2)(g)(i) to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through the free and frank expression of opinions
- [35] 9(2)(g)(ii) to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through protecting ministers, members of government organisations, officers and employees from improper pressure or harassment;
- [36] 9(2)(h) to maintain legal professional privilege
- [37] 9(2)(i) to enable the Crown to carry out commercial activities without disadvantage or prejudice
- [38] 9(2)(j) to enable the Crown to negotiate without disadvantage or prejudice
- [39] 9(2)(k) to prevent the disclosure of official information for improper gain or improper advantage
- [40] 18(c)(i) that the making available of the information requested would be contrary to the provisions of a specified enactment

Budget 2024 decisions – Vote Environment

Following our discussions over the past weeks, this letter confirms the decisions made as part of Budget 2024. The proposed revenue increases as a result of changes to the Waste Disposal Levy and Waste Minimisation Initiatives have been included in the Budget package, however, are subject to Cabinet consideration and therefore, are not reflected in the attached portfolio overview.

In relation to the Ministry for the Environment's baseline savings submissions (IDs 15573, 15585, 15586, 15588 and 15591), the Treasury has advised me that the Ministry highlighted reduced capability to engage with and act in good faith in its partnership with Māori a result of progressing these savings. I would be grateful if you could please re-iterate to the Ministry the Government's expectation that they continue to prioritise meeting their Treaty of Waitangi obligations, despite their reduced baseline.

I would be grateful if you could direct your officials to work with the Treasury to prepare the necessary Estimates and Supplementary Estimates material for your sign off by 24 April.

A reminder that these decisions remain Budget Sensitive and should only be shared a need-to-know basis. My office will provide further advice on the approach to Budget communications. Thank you again for your support towards the successful delivery of Budget 2024.
