Key to sections of the Act under which information has been withheld:

- [23] 9(2)(a) to protect the privacy of natural persons, including deceased people
- [25] 9(2)(b)(ii) to protect the commercial position of the person who supplied the information or who is the subject of the information
- [27] 9(2)(ba)(ii) to protect information which is subject to an obligation of confidence or which any person has been or could be compelled to provide under the authority of any enactment, where the making available of the information would be likely otherwise to damage the public interest
- [31] 9(2)(f)(ii) to maintain the current constitutional conventions protecting collective and individual ministerial responsibility
- [33] 9(2)(f)(iv) to maintain the current constitutional conventions protecting the confidentiality of advice tendered by ministers and officials
- [34] 9(2)(g)(i) to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through the free and frank expression of opinions
- [35] 9(2)(g)(ii) to maintain the effective conduct of public affairs through protecting ministers, members of government organisations, officers and employees from improper pressure or harassment;
- [36] 9(2)(h) to maintain legal professional privilege
- [37] 9(2)(i) to enable the Crown to carry out commercial activities without disadvantage or prejudice
- [38] 9(2)(j) to enable the Crown to negotiate without disadvantage or prejudice
- [39] 9(2)(k) to prevent the disclosure of official information for improper gain or improper advantage
- [40] 18(c)(i) that the making available of the information requested would be contrary to the provisions of a specified enactment

Budget 2024 decisions – Vote Transport

Following our discussions over the past weeks, this letter confirms the decisions made as part of Budget 2024. This excludes the two initiatives (the Rail Network Improvement Plan and the additional funding for the delivery of the Government Policy Statement on land transport) that officials are still working through following our meeting on 11 April 2024.

This also includes the decision to return the tagged contingency listed in the attached table.

I would be grateful if you could direct your officials to work with the Treasury to complete the financial recommendations, as well as to prepare the necessary Estimates and Supplementary Estimates material for your sign off by 18 April.

I ask that you work with the Ministry of Transport (as the monitoring department) to inform Waka Kotahi New Zealand Transport Agency (NZTA) in confidence of the Budget 2024 decisions that directly affect them. Please ensure this happens as soon as possible so that NZTA can submit their Budget Economic and Fiscal Update forecasts to the Treasury by 1pm 16 April 2024.

A reminder that these decisions remain Budget Sensitive and should only be shared on a need-to-know basis. My office will provide further advice on the approach to Budget communications. Thank you again for your support towards the successful delivery of Budget 2024.
